Current & Upcoming Events:

- PSR classes will begin Sunday, September 7. Classes will be held on Sunday, Monday and Wednesday.
- Three small catechist camps that targeted certain grades were held in August. Having the camps for specific grades allowed for more interaction among the catechist and grade levels.
- PSR Open House took place on August after all Masses on the weekends of 8/16 & 17 and 8/23 & 24. Students and parents picked up their student folders and information for the upcoming school year. They also had the opportunity to tour the Parish Center. Late registration was also taken at that time. About 85% of the folders were picked up.
