#### What is Prayer? By Fr. Rick Bolte

We often view prayer as something we do to please God, help ourselves, and to seek something good for someone else. We don't easily recognize or give credit to God's Spirit who dwells in our hearts and stirs us to respond to God. Before we even think to pray, God is already reaching out to us and desiring to be in relationship with us. The stirring of the Spirit is like the vibrations on our cell phones letting us know there is a call. God hopes we answer.

Our answer is an expression from our heart. Scripture speaks of prayer most often as emanating from our hearts. In our efforts to pray, we try to express in words what we experience in our hearts. We often don't know the right words as Paul tells us in Romans (Romans 8:26 In the same way, the Spirit too comes to the aid of our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit itself intercedes with inexpressible groanings.) Saying words, no matter how full of good, religious thoughts, are in vain if our hearts are not with God. (Catechism of the Catholic Church; #2562)

Prayer ultimately is the living relationship of the children of God with their heavenly Father, Jesus Christ his Son, and the Holy Spirit. A life of prayer is a habit of being in the presence of and in communion with the triune God. (Catechism of the Catholic Church; #2565). The Catholic Catechism speaks of five forms of prayer (#2626-2643). They are all expressions of this relationship.

Blessings and Adoration begin with the realization that we have been greatly blessed by our God. It is the realization of and acceptance of the blessings we have received. Adoration is especially that awe we experience as we recognize our limits as a mere creature before the almighty creator

of all. It is often expressed in respectful silence as we are humble before the awesome God who made us and has given us all we are.

Our prayer of supplication is most often expressed as a prayer of petition wherein we are aware of our creaturehood. We are not our own beginning, masters of our adversity, nor our last end. We are indeed sinners who have turned away from God and our petition is our turning back to him. The first movement of this prayer is acknowledging that we have turned away from God and now ask for forgiveness. The petition asking for forgiveness is a prerequisite of righteous and pure prayer. Trusting humility brings us back into the relationship with God. Christian petition is centered on the desire for the fulfillment of God's kingdom. We seek to collaborate in the mission of Christ and ask for what is necessary to welcome and cooperate with its coming. When we share in Christ's saving love, we realize that all needs become the object of petition.

Intercession is a prayer of petition wherein we seek to pray as Jesus did. He intercedes with the Father on behalf of all; especially sinners. All who draw near to God through him are saved. Intercession, asking on behalf of another, is characteristic of a heart attuned to God's mercy. This prayer is an expression of the Christian community united in concern for one another. Intercessory prayer knows no boundaries. It prays for those who persecute you and for the salvation of all who reject the Gospel.

Thanksgiving characterizes the prayer of the church. It is a recognition of all that God

is doing to restore humanity to a relationship with himself. And in that unity is the community of all peoples. This prayer recognizes the many things God has done and is doing and offers a prayer of thanksgiving.

Praise is looking beyond the individual acts of God and lauds God for his own sake. It is the praising of God simply because he is God.

The Eucharist contains and expresses all forms of prayer. The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life. By the Eucharistic celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all. (#1326)

reconciliation, and almsgiving (Acts of Mercy) and as Isaiah said, "This rather is the fasting that I wish: sharing your bread with the hungry, sheltering the homeless and clothing the naked." These 3 acts of kindness are a passion for Vincentians! And Christ reminds us, "Whatever you do for the least of these, you do for me."

Do you have 1 day a week to commit to enriching your faith and lifting your neighbors in need? Is God calling you to be a Vincentian? **Would you join us** for a family visit and experience what we do first hand?

With your help, support and prayer we have accomplished some amazing transformations over the past six years. To continue that success we need YOU! — YOUR PRAYERS, YOUR TIME, YOUR TALENT, and YOUR TREASURE. Contact Debbie Curtin 513-532-6958 for information about changing lives and giving you new direction and "PURPOSE."

In the last two months we've received over 100 calls for assistance and provided nearly \$19,000 in resources including: food (donated by our parishioners), clothing, beds, rent, housing and utilities. Our monthly parish donations rarely exceed \$1500 and our requests for assistance vary from \$100 to more than \$3000. Thankfully, we are good stewards of your donations and we have some amazing resources to share, but the past two months have seriously depleted our funds and negatively impacted our ability to respond. If you are consider-

ing Lenten Alms, **now would be the perfect time to support us**. We cherish regular monthly donations of any denomination.

Our Priests have been encouraging us to become personally involved – To find "purpose" in our lives, step out of our comfort zones and bring comfort to those who are searching for love and acceptance. The beauty of "purpose" is that you are gifted well beyond what you give. Imagine the satisfaction of providing new school/winter clothing, putting meat on the table, or preventing a utility shut off or an eviction.


Perhaps the unexpected benefit of joining the Vincentian family is the spiritual enrichment you gain from the prayerful approach of our meetings and joint calls (we, like the disciples, always pray with our families and visit in two's).

Covid has had a severe impact on our families and our ability to support them in traditional ways, but we have continued to serve families with children, the homeless, seniors, veterans, and anyone within our parish boundaries who requests our support. One notable case involved a 62-yearold grandmother with heart issues who is raising 7 grandchildren - including a newborn baby - in a trailer in need of repair. Our state senator, John Schickel, a member of the parish, intervened to procure the benefits which she had been denied. St. Henry's High School provided Christmas cheer. St. Timothy has taken the lead on resources (clothing, utilities, food, beds, etc.) and a St. Tim's parishioner volunteered to make needed repairs to the trailer, giving comfort to this family.

#### Outreach

There are so many different Outreach activities here at St. Timothy. Come join in the fun!

Work has begun in planning for our Fr. Ruschman's Garden to be planted. 30 gardeners gathered to share a meal, discuss which vegetables to plant, learn of the garden tool needs and determine the 1<sup>st</sup> planting date in early April. Each summer we harvest on Monday evenings with a delivery on Tuesday to Rose Garden Center for Hope and Healing. We recently learned they provide food for 200 -1000 people daily. On Thursday morning we harvest vegetables to be delivered to City Heights for distribution to 300 + families. There is nothing better than time with fellow parishioners working in the garden. Please come join us this year.

In February we heard from one of our grant recipients, Sheila Carroll, about God's work being done at Rose Garden Center for Hope and Healing for the residents in need in Covington. They provide dental help, medical help, prenatal care, new parent packages, diapers, clothing, baby furniture and car seats, and food to those in need of assistance. Or those suffering from food insecurity. March found 20 of our parishioners volunteering at the Center to clean floors, wash toys, sort items in the warehouse, sort children's clothing by gender and size, repackage diapers, stack and count formula. We were able to see all the great work the Sisters are doing and be a small part of helping our commu-

**40 Cans for Lent** is in full swing. The Knights of Columbus are collecting all canned and boxed items to be distributed before Easter to several area nonprofit food banks. Please check our website for a full list of items needed. The last day to contribute is Palm Sunday. We could use a few people to help us repack the food

items after the 11:30 Mass.

Mary Rose Mission continues to feed 75-100 people every evening. Our day is the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of every month. The guests look forward to our signature dish of chicken spaghetti, garlic bread, salad and dessert. It is one of their favorite meals! We are always looking for prep cook help, servers and dishwashers and of course help purchasing dinner items needed each month.

Several men, women and students signed up for our **Mission Trip** to Harlan KY in June. We are having a few fundraisers to keep the cost affordable for our students. Thank you to everyone who purchased Poseidon's Pizza during our evening fundraising night. Please consider purchasing candles, emptying your pockets or donate funds to help our students put their **faith in action** to "Build The Kingdom".

This year we mailed out almost 60 letters inviting NKY nonprofit agencies to apply for one of six possible **St. Timothy Grants**. The deadline for receiving them is March 31. The Outreach committee will spend the month of April reviewing each application. We will then meet in April to choose the six recipients for next year. Keep us in your prayers as we discern each agency.

In addition, our committee has been working on the Outreach part of the strategic plan and reviewing our upcoming facility needs. I am grateful for all the volunteers who sign up to help on our projects. I love seeing the Holy Spirit at work in everything we do. This is a giving parish indeed. Lastly, I have been blessed with an amazing group of people who help guide our ministry and are instrumental in making things happen. All in all, we provide 17 plus Outreach activities. We help our parishioners with an opportunity to give back. Thank you Susan, Kelli, Carolyn, Kate, Rosalie, Bev, Lois, Christie, and Mary Jo. You all are the BEST!

In the spring of 2020, Covid 19 brought tumultuous times to St. Timothy Parish and to the world. We were asked to quarantine, wear masks and social distance when we were out. Mass was live streamed and the faithful tuned in from home. Watching the Easter Vigil, my favorite service of the year, online was just sad but the Church continues.

In May, we returned to church and were greeted by masked faces, green tape on the pews, limited singing, no handshake of peace and lots of hand sanitizer—but we were back and the Church continues.

Fast forward to July, 2021. The church renovations began and we moved to Brodnik Hall, aka the basement. We began the move after 11:30 Mass. Lots of people were there to help and things went pretty smoothly. About 2:15, as a

group of ladies were finishing up decorating around the altar and setting up things for Mass, Fr. Bolte told us that we had to finish soon because he had a Baptism scheduled for 3 PM and the Church continues—in the basement.

What joy we felt when, at Christmas, we were able to move into our beautiful new worship space,

Now that we are back, I realize how much I appreciate the things that we missed off and on over the last two years. I love to hear the musicians and congregation making beautiful music together, seeing the servers back in their albs adding to the solemnity of the celebration, and the congregation acknowledging each other with a smile and a wave at the handshake of peace. Most importantly, we can kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer, receive the Eucharist in person, something I sorely missed during the time we were quarantined. Last but not least, my time in the basement taught me that I need to have reverence for our worship space and respect for those who want to pray in quiet. Let's take our conversations to the gathering space.

Next time you are at church, take a moment to appreciate what we have at St. Timothy and realize that because of all of us, the Church continues.

As you may have experienced when you plan a party at your own home, it is a challenge to plan the right amount of food. You do not want to have too many leftovers, but you always want to be sure everyone has enough to eat. With parish events, it is the same situation, but it's generally a larger scale. goal is to not have too many leftovers.

With Fish Fry, we have been averaging about 1,200+ meals in the first 3 weeks. Even with previous years to review, it's hard to know how much to plan for as well as how the weather will impact the number of people that attend. However, this isn't about the planning part of Fish Fry. It's about what happens when we cook too much of any item. Did you know

that we do not throw out the leftovers?

At the end of the night on Friday, there are volunteers that help pack up all of the leftovers. On Monday morning, all of the leftovers are taken down to meet the needs of the families and people at City Heights. Food is never wasted even if too much is made. This is just another way St. Timothy provides outreach to people outside of our parish.

#### **Sacrament Preparation Programs**

#### **First Reconciliation & Communion**

- \* Students in public schools preparing for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion must have a year of religious education prior to the year the sacraments are received. So, students must attend in 1st grade to receive the Sacraments in second grade.
- \* Catholic school and Catholic Home School students must register in the PSR program for their second grade year so they can attend the retreats and sacrament celebrations.

#### Confirmation


- \* Students in public schools must attend PSR through their seventh grade year and complete the required service hours and participate in the Mass activities.
- \* Confirmation happens in the eighth grade year. This is a busy year with a group service project, Sponsor activities and retreat. PSR students continue to attend classes. Catholic Home School and Catholic School students attend the extra events, and all students sign in for Mass and complete independent service hours.

#### Continuing Education Classes - 3<sup>rd</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> grade

\* Between the Sacrament years our religious education program strengthens our students' faith knowledge focusing on the Mass, Ten Commandments, Sacraments and the Covenants. These are great years to include your children in so they are ready in their 7<sup>th</sup> grade year to begin an in-depth look at Jesus' life, and prepare to confirm their faith.




