A Persistent Sinner By Fr. Rick Bolte

I've been a sinner all my life. Some of my sins go back about as far as I can remember. I have gotten better at controlling the outward expression of the worst of them and have managed to keep others from seeing my failures too readily, but in my heart much of the sin remains.

I remember when I first started going to confession, I expected that once I confessed a sin, it would be gone. I enjoyed the idea that I got a fresh start free from sin. I was told that if I was struck and killed by a car on the way home from confession, I would go straight to heaven.

That sense of having a clean soul and being free from sin didn't last long, especially being one of six kids. I kept thinking somehow I was supposed to keep from doing the same sins over and over again. It was very frustrating and discouraging. Whether in school or with my parents over the summer, I went to confession every month. There was no option to go face to face so I never knew if the priest recognized my voice. As such, my confessions became a routine of reciting my grocery list of sins and my penance was usually a seemingly generic recitation of Our Father's and Hail Mary's.

This persisted even when I went to the seminary for college. Even when I went face to face to a priest who knew me, he would seem to treat me as if he didn't know me. That was very awkward for me. I went back to going behind the screen and to a priest who didn't know my voice. I started going less often too as it seemed to lose meaning for me.


As I would hear reports of fewer and fewer people going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, I used to imagine that someday the

sacrament would be dropped from the list of seven. Though presumptuous and naive, I couldn't figure out why we needed to go especially when I realized that God forgave us even without going to Reconciliation.

It wasn't until I went to graduate school at a seminary in New York that I had my first experience of what more the Sacrament had to offer. I remember going to the Sacrament with my spiritual director and sharing with him the struggles of my life and in particular my sins. I tearfully shared how I struggled to believe and especially experience God's love when I was always a sinner. What I came to know was God as not just a judge but as one who truly called me (us) though we are sinners. God's love wasn't a reward for good behavior but a gift for all his children. I was a beloved child.

Even then I expected things to change. If I could allow myself to truly believe and appreciate the love God had for me, shouldn't my heart change and shouldn't I become free from sin? I was puzzled by the great saints and mystics who would constantly speak of their utter sinfulness. I thought perhaps they were being overly holy; a bit sensationalistic and even sanctimoniously holy. Surely they couldn't see themselves as sinners, at least not compared to us common sinners.

Though truly God's love has changed my heart, it has not taken away all my sin. That's not to say it hasn't had an effect. I am far less compulsive in my sins and do experience God's presence far more in my life. Going to Reconciliation means more to me now than ever before. But I am still a

I don't believe it was ever God's plan that I should be able to overcome all sin in my life. So far it's been a journey of discovering ever more deeply what a sinner I am. It makes me always aware that I am not self-reliant but humbly dependent on God. As the underserving one, I can be more aware of just how generous and loving God is toward me. Aware of my sin, I can be compassionate to others who struggle with their sin.

The Circle Game

One of my favorite songs is from Joni Mitchell called "The Circle Game". In this song, she writes about a young man and a young woman and their growing up. There's a line in the chorus that says: "we can't return, we can only look behind from where we came and go around and around and around in the circle game". I'm not sure if I agree with the idea that we can't return from where we came. We can certainly never go back the way we were, but we can reconnect with our past to see how far we've come.

As a I grow older, I come to recognize those circles in my life. When I watch my son Nick dealing with his kids and the issues that go with that, I see that circle. I'm usually laughing at that circle especially when the kids are acting up a bit. They don't do that when they're with us (at least I don't notice it, but we're grandparents). I see that circle everyday when I drive to St. Anne Retreat Center. I pass the Freewill Baptist Church I attended in Silver Grove on the way there. Most recently, I saw a circle of life at the Easter Vigil when one of our students came into the Church on that glorious night.

The pastor of the Freewill Baptist Church we attended in Dayton, Ky., was Bill Phillips. Bill was a good and holy man and a fine pastor. Bill worked for the railroad and was a hard-working driven man. He loved the Lord and it showed in how he preached and carried himself. His son, Bill, Jr. was one of my friends at that church. It was quite a surprise for me when Bill, Jr. and his lovely wife Patti entered our RCIA class this past fall. Talk about a circle that was a great blessing. To see him and Patti experience the Eucharist for the first time at the Vigil was awesome as it was with all of this past class. Pray for all of those who have entered the Church that they find their place in the life of this wonderful parish.

All of us experience these circles in our faith life. The terms used are the exitus or moving away from God and the reditus or returning to God. We've all experienced those times when we feel we're not close to God, that he's nowhere to be found. But if we work our way through this spiritual dryness, we find ourselves on that return trip to Him. We do that through staying faithful to the Sacraments, through prayer and growing in our knowledge of the faith.

It's that knowledge of the faith that I am particularly emphatic on in the RCIA class. That's why Monsignor Bill Cleves and I have begun a weekly podcast called Catholic Soup. It is available in iTunes, Spotify and Google Play. Each week we cover a topic related to growing in the faith and the journey towards a deeper relationship with Christ. We don't script them; we just start talking and the results have been somewhat surprising in a good way. We're getting comments and followers from all over and that's been fun. They're only about 20 minutes each week since we don't want to make them too long for people to listen. Give it a try and I hope you'll find them helpful to you.

Pay attention to those circles you find in your life. They're more prevalent than you may realize. I see them more and more in my life's experiences. I think it comes with age and maybe a greater sense of awareness. Also, focus on trying to shorten that exitus and reditus from God. The longer we're away, the harder it is to get back. But remember this, God is always there waiting for us to return. It's worth the trip and the effort to get back to him. It's the most important circle of all.



Registration Information for PSR Classes

We are currently taking registrations for the 2019-2020 PSR school year. Registration forms are available in the parish office, school office and online. Classes are in St. Timothy Catholic School, and it is going to be another great year, filled with great family faith enriching activities. Give your child the advantage of a strong moral character to help them succeed in all they do.

The Parish School Religion program is designed as a companion to Mass. Our Catholic Faith is rich in tradition and draws us together as a community, but if you are not celebrating the Sacrament of the Eucharist weekly, you are missing out on the Grace of God that strengthens you to get through it all. Come to Mass and fill yourself up every week with God's love.

Sacrament Preparation Programs:

First Reconciliation & First Holy Communion - 2nd Grade Year

- * Students in public schools must have attended a previous year of religious education, and be enrolled in Religious Education through the 2nd grade year.
- * Catholic based homeschool and Catholic school students register in the PSR program in their 2nd grade year and attend retreats and practice dates.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated in December. The Sacrament of First Holy Communion is celebrated in April.

Confirmation - 8th Grade Year

- * Students in public schools must have at least one year of religious education prior to the year of Confirmation.
- * All students, public school, Catholic homeschool, and Catholic School, attend PSR classes at St. Timothy through the Confirmation year. They must attend all required classes, retreats, and activities during the year and complete hours of service.

The Sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated in late January or early February.

Religious Education Classes for the 3rd through 6th Grade

Once your child has celebrated the 2nd grade sacraments, there is still much more to learn about their faith before their next big sacrament preparation begins in the 7th grade for confirmation in 8th grade. From the connection of all Catholic churches, how the Ten Commandments guide our lives, connecting to Jesus with the Sacraments and learning about God's plan for us through the Old Testament. The Parish Education Program also helps keep your child connected to the Parish Family, involved in Mass and celebrating the Sacraments.

Our Sunday mornings at 8 am class gets out at 9:15 am, so your family can attend the 9:30 am Mass together. The 10 am class gets out at 11:15 am so your family can attend 11:30 Mass together. Our Wednesday night class starts at 6 pm and ends at 7:15 pm. Our Program offers a flexibility that other extracurricular activities cannot. If your child cannot make their regularly scheduled class, they can attend another class in that same week. We are also willing to switch class times through the year if your child's fall activity schedule varies from the spring schedule. I would rather be accommodating and keep your child connected, please contact me if you have any questions. clense@saint-timothy.org

Continue to hold a leading role in your child's religious education by participating in our Religious Program.

Catechist - Responsible for instruction and conducting classes throughout the school year. Lesson plans, including activities are provided to create a framework and guide for teaching.

* Free tuition in all religious education programs

Liturgical Minister – Leading the Liturgy of the Word for the 1st – 4th graders who choose to join the children's liturgy during the 9:30 and 11:30 Mass times. Children return to Mass for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Classroom Assistant - Supports the catechist as needed in conducting class and completing creative activities. May be called upon to substitute if needed. Access to all lessons and training.






St. Timothy's Choir Camp


Happenings around the Preschool





Prison Ministry

God spoke to me about getting involved in Prison Ministry. Initially, I thought about it, and I even asked God if He was sure that He was talking to the right person. Then, when I agreed to investigate it, I was led to the proper people. God had it all planned for me.

I attended a talk about a woman who had been in and out of prison for many years, and I was touched by her story. Additionally, I read in the *Messenger* that Catholic Charities was seeking volunteers for prison ministry, so I contacted the person in charge and received information. After an orientation and completing paperwork, I was soon approved to enter detention centers in Kenton County, and I am currently awaiting approval for Boone and Campbell Counties.

My first visit was on February 4, and at first I was not sure that I would be any help. But, I asked God for His guidance. Three volunteers entered the facility that night to meet with ten women in a parenting class. Using a structured book with twelve chapters, the women answer questions verbally and in writing in order to receive a certificate after completing the class.

There are two stories that I want to share to illustrate specific ways that this class has positively impacted women's lives. The first is that of a woman who went to court after completing the class, and because she had finished it, she was able to spend 30 minutes with her newborn child. This was the first time that she was able to hold her child. I will always remember that. In the second story, another woman's sentence was decreased because she had finished the class. Both situations show that our ministry is helping.

I certainly hope that I am helping them as much as they are helping me. The women are teaching me a great deal. During one moving visit, tears were shed. Consequently, another volunteer and I let the women know that if they would like a hug, we would love to give them one. Several women approached me for a hug, and I told them that I love them. In addition, the way the women share in class is amazing. I feel their pain and their love for their children. They know that they must change, and they all want to change. They want to become better parents. Most importantly, I discuss God as much as I can.

One night, while waiting for the guard to unlock the door so that volunteers could leave, the women began to talk. They communicated things that you may not know, as I did not. When they enter, they are given a cup and one towel, and they must purchase a washcloth. The towels smell badly, like they were left in the dryer before being dried. Moreover, the women don't feel like women sometimes, and they use butter to keep their lips from chapping. God asked me to tell them that they all have beautiful souls. I did, and some of them thanked me.

Several women have approached me to thank me for volunteering in this ministry. They need this class, and they want to attend. Without volunteers, they cannot complete the class or receive the certificates that help them.

Provident God spoke to me, and I answered the call. I am so glad that I did. This ministry has made me a better person. We may not always realize it, but God loves all His children the same. Prison ministry opened my eyes and heart to that. I am so grateful that God called me.

The **Knights of Columbus** Council 15211 thanks you for your support of our Lil' Timmy mini-donut program. We had our inaugural sale last March and offered Lil' Timmy's five weekends in 2018. You purchased a total of 2,244 dozen and the proceeds allowed us to pay off much of our startup expenses. Once all of our startup obligations are met we plan to offer Lil' Timmy sales as fund raisers in support of various parish organizations.

We had a sale in February and April already this year and Lil' Timmy's will be offered June 22/23, August 24/25, October 19/20 and December 14/15.



The **Knights of Columbus**, in partnership with the **Hoxworth Blood Center**, have been hosting spring and fall blood drives in the parish since the Council was formed in 2010. During that period, 548 units of

blood products have been collected, with each unit able to provide life sustaining support to three patients. There are 31-area hospitals that depend on Hoxworth to register 400 donors a day, every day, to meet their needs. Cancer patients may need 8-25 units per treatment, while an organ transplant may require over 100 units for the procedure.

The rarest blood type is the one not on the shelf when it is needed. That could be yours. The Knights will host their next drive on October 2. Remember to give the gift of life, that is the **RED** thing to do.


