## **United Catholic Movement - Why?**

"Fr. Bob Bedard, founder of the community of priests called the Companions of the Cross, used to say that evangelization was "one beggar telling another where to find bread." Christ is called the "Bread of Life." Do we need Christ as much as a beggar needs bread?

When our lives are busy and we feel we are constantly rushing to and fro and all we seem to feel is stress, we know we need something. We need a break, a vacation, some help from our spouse, coworker, or children. When we have a chance to slow down, we want to be entertained and distracted from whatever is bothering us. In this picture God seems mostly unreal, distant, and more a luck charm when we call for help.

How does one find God in a modern life with work, children, caring for relatives and neighbors, taking care of the household chores, etc., etc. If you come to Mass even occasionally and even that you are taking time to read this, you are blessed. God has found a way to reach you enough that you are at least looking and open to God being at least part of the answer. That may not seem like much and may not be very strong, but remember Jesus' parable of the mustard seed and the yeast. It may be small but it can grow.

Crucial is a simple but well-grounded beginning recognizing how small our faith and relationship to God may truly be. Beginning with what is honest and true is the only sure place to start. We can then speak to God of our weakness, our inability to do what we feel we should do, and even our powerlessness to actually follow through with what we promise God and ourselves. A

humble, contrite heart God will not spurn but is instead a worthy sacrifice (Ps 51:17). It's good to remember that the things we do wrong or fail to do good are just symptoms of our sinfulness, our separation from God.

This humble state is how we are invited to begin our Eucharistic celebration; we acknowledge our sins. We come to God who was "sent to heal the contrite of heart" (words from the Penitential Rite.) We call on the Lord's mercy as we realize, that of our own will, we will fail. Yet, having received instruction from the Word of God, we proceed to celebrate that Christ chooses to come into our midst. And simple acknowledging the power of God's Word to heal, we accept Jesus "under our roof."

What Good News! We don't need to already be good. We don't need to know and understand all that God teaches. We don't even need to be as humble as we should be. We only need to recognize that the way we have pursued peace and joy with the things of this world doesn't seem to work and be open to the possibility that God might have the answer. God has a way of inviting us to look, and once we say yes to that, to lead us ever further.

God leads us beyond the distractions: the Church is too liberal or conservative; I like or don't like particular deacons, priests, bishops, or the pope; I like or don't like the music, outreach, or how often they say the rosary; etc. God is with us in a very personal way. God speaks to our hearts through what we hear, see, read, and do (good and bad). No matter where we are as we begin our journey, our yearning for God leads us to imitate him. We are enabled to do what we

#### On the Road to Find Out

In April, I celebrated a couple of anniversaries that are rather significant. I had my four-year anniversary of being ordained a Permanent Deacon. Lynn and I also celebrated our twenty third year of our conversion to Catholicism. Now there's nothing particularly important about those anniversaries, it just offered an opportunity to reflect on the spiritual journey I've been on throughout my life.

There's a great old Cat Stevens song that describes this journey called "On the Road to Find Out" and that's a very good description. This journey is all about finding out where God is in my life and how it impacts the way I live and interact with my fellow man. It's not a straight-line journey, it's not even a straight ahead journey. There have been many twists and turns, many steps forward and too many backward. But all along, it's a seeking of God and that's what is important.

There's a pretty safe assumption that all of us have followed a similar type of road in our lives. Although some people seem to have less of a struggle than others, most of us experience some times of doubt and wonder as to what the best way to pursue God may be. Some may even wonder whether God exists at all. That's ok as long as one continues to seek. The road eventually leads to the Creator because we are the created. It is only when we stop seeking that finding him will not be possible. Even then, he seeks us and if we're paying attention, we'll figure that out.

Some struggle with the idea of whether being Catholic is right for them. There is an easy answer but a hard explanation. The Catholic Church is the Church founded by Jesus himself with St. Peter being named the rock on which the Church will be built. Of course we should all be Catholic for this very reason. However, some struggle with doctrine and dogma of the Church particularly as it relates to the culture today. That's understandable because we've done a poor job of teaching the reasons for that doctrine and dogma. Without knowing the underlying reasons for it, it comes off as a list of do's and don'ts and that doesn't appeal to anyone. Unless we understand the love of all human beings no matter the human condition, none of it makes sense. Rules are important but the underlying reason for them are even more important. These teachings are guidelines for living a life here on earth that gets us to the next one, eternity.

There's an old saying that says "there's no Catholic like a convert" and I think that's true. Those of us who come from other faith traditions, see things that most Catholics born into the faith take for granted. We see the beauty in the traditions, we see the beauty in the liturgy and we find a sacredness and peace that we've been seeking in other places. I've studied to be a deacon, got a Master's degree in Church Management, read countless books and I feel like I've just scratched the surface of the depth and beauty of the Church.

When I read authors like St. John of the Cross, St. Augustine, Thomas Merton, Hans Urs Von Balthasar and Henri de Lubac, I'm blown away by the greatness of their work. The list of these authors goes on and on. That's not to mention the beautiful documents of the Church written by our Popes through the centuries. The documents of Vatican II are a masterpiece of Christian thought.

But the greatest gift I've been given in the Church is the source, center and summit of the Church's life and that is the Most Blessed Eucharist. It is Jesus who gives himself totally in this great Sacrament. This is what unites us as Catholics and cannot be found anywhere else. The Protestants believe in the symbolism of it, we know that Jesus is truly present body, blood, soul and divinity in the Eucharist. It is not a symbol but a reality that is beyond our comprehension. That's why I want my family and friends who are away from the Church to come back. They are missing the feast, the banquet of our Lord and I want them there with me.

No one likes to see the empty chair at the table when it could be filled with someone we care about.

We're all on the road to find out. We can call that road Emmaus because just like the disciples on that road, we discover Jesus when we hear his words and participate in the breaking of the bread. Let's invite all we can on that walk, with all of our imperfections, failures and worries. There's plenty room on the road and the banquet is prepared for all who are ready to find Jesus.








#### Now is the TIME to REGISTER for PSR

We are currently taking registrations for the 2017-2018 PSR schoolyear. Registration forms are available in the Parish Office and online. We will be holding classes in St. Timothy Catholic School, and it is going to be an eventful year. We will be participating in the reading the Rosary before Mass on the 5<sup>th</sup> Sundays, and we will lead a Living Rosary in October for Respect Life month. We will have a celebration evening with the Live Nativity during Advent. We will be scheduling Youth Greeters during February and leading the Stations of the Cross during Lent.

#### **Sacrament Preparation Programs**

## First Reconciliation & First Holy Communion – 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Year

- Students in public schools must have attended a previous year of religious education, and be enrolled in Religious Education through the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade year.
- Catholic based homeschool and Catholic school students register in the PSR program in their 2<sup>nd</sup> grade year and attend retreats and practice dates.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated in December. The Sacrament of First Holy Communion is celebrated in April.

#### Confirmation

- Students in public schools must have at least one year of religious education prior to the year of Confirmation.
- Catholic school and Catholic based homeschool students must register in the PSR program for the Confirmation year.
- All students attend PSR classes at St. Timothy through the Confirmation year. They must attend all required classes, retreats, and activities during the year and complete hours of service.

The Sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated in late January or early February. The date for this coming year has not yet been set by the Bishop.

## Religious Education Classes for the 3<sup>rd</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> grade

Once your child has celebrated the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade sacraments, there is still much more to learn about their faith before their next big sacrament preparation begins in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade for confirmation in 8<sup>th</sup> grade. From the connection of all Catholic churches, how the Ten Commandments guide our lives, connecting to Jesus with the Sacraments and learning about God's plan for us through the Old Testament. The Parish Education Program also helps keep your child connected to the Parish Family, involved in Mass and celebrating the Sacraments.

Our Religious Education Program offers a flexibility that other extracurricular activities cannot. If your child cannot make their regularly scheduled class, they can attend another class in that same week. We are also willing to switch class times through the year if your child's fall activity schedule varies from the spring schedule. I would rather be accommodating and keep your child connected, please contact me if you have any questions.


















#### The Gift of Femininity
