#### God Writes Straight with Crooked Lines By Fr. Rick Bolte



**Proverbs 9:10** The beginning of wisdom is fear of the LORD, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding.

**Psalms 111:10** The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom; prudent are all who practice it. His praise endures forever.

My retreat began with a visit to the chapel. There I sat in the back aware that I did not deserve to be there. How could I presume to be in God's presence knowing my sin. I am aware of how I have hurt others from the time of my youth until now and I cannot change what I have done nor make up for it or fix it. I cannot earn forgiveness. And my sin has not ended. Even in the best of things that I do there is an element of selfishness. How could I presume to be in God's presence much less be his priest. Such honest and humble facing of reality is, I believe, the fear of the Lord.

I have to ask myself, "Why do I dare then to be in the presence of God?" The only answer is that God, who knows me completely, has invited me. God knows me better than I know myself; God knows my sin even when I am unaware of it. Yet God chooses to love me and invite me to be with him. I believe faith is that gift of being able to believe in God's love for me when I am mindful of how much I don't deserve it.

Paul tells us that we are saved by faith (Romans 3:28). I do believe the real saving power of God comes through that gift of


knowing we are beloved of God. This is true faith! Only as a humble sinner can we begin to realize the depth of that gift and to experience the love that changes our heart. That faith, that grace makes us want to respond; to love God in return. To love God is to love all that is of God; the whole human family and all of creation.

As a sinner I dare to be a priest. As sinners, we all choose to love spouse, family, friends, the needy and undeserving. Not because we are good enough but because we want to respond to the love God has for us. Even though we are flawed, we can nonetheless choose to love as God loves us. We can, even though our faults can get in the way, do the will of our Father. And amazingly, God can do great things through us.

We can look around ourselves and think where we have been. We can look at the history of our Church and of our parish. We can look at the story of our parish's outreach ministry, our Garden of Gratitude, and any of our ministries to parishioners and people outside our parish. Good things are happening even though only sinners are trying to reveal the love of God. It is awesome what God can do even through sinners like us.

It is good to contemplate our sinfulness, the mercy and love of God, and our need for that gift of faith. Let us pray asking that God's goodness will shine through us revealing His goodness which is so beyond us!

#### **Parish School Religion (PSR)**

PSR Classes are well under way for the 2021-2022 school year. We have 378 students enrolled this year, with 69 students preparing for Confirmation and 108 students preparing for the sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. It was wonderful to welcome new Catechists once again this year. We welcomed new Parish Members, returning Catechists and current family parents into our Catechist team. This is a trend that has been growing for a couple years, even in the craziness the past year has brought. We are truly blessed in our Parish to have so many who share their faith.

#### The Children's Liturgy Program is back in action!

We offer Children's Liturgy at the 9:30 and 11:30 Mass. We invite children in 1<sup>st</sup> through 4<sup>th</sup> grade to join us for a study of God's word on their level. We received a great outpouring of volunteers, though we always have room for additional leaders. Our Children's Liturgy assistants have been doing a great job to facilitate this program, even during renovations.

#### **Confirmation Events:**

Mission Monday was October 11, and our Confirmation students went out to support their Outreach Agencies. We have some great pictures of our hard working students.

Mark your calendar for the Christmas Giving Fair- December 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>. Come visit after Mass to hear from them first-hand about the great things they did to support their agency and see how you can help as well.

#### First Reconciliation:

We have 110 students preparing for First Reconciliation. What an exciting time in their Faith Journey. Confession is a Sacrament that shows God's love for us, in his forgiving of our sins, and love and desire to help us live our best life. 
#### RCIA.....A Journey in Faith By Debbi Cranley

#### St. Timothy - Outreach

I am excited at the many outreach volunteer opportunities St. Timothy offers our parishioners and blessed with many volunteers. We have something for everyone! Your time, talent and treasure are welcomed with open arms. Drivers helping parishioners get to doctors' appointments and running errands, people who can volunteer on a monthly basis at a soup kitchen and opportunities to volunteer on our service projects or supplying requested items for babies, children, families, our elder community and our homebound members. Words cannot express enough all my gratitude to work with all of you. *Thank you, thank you, thank you!* 

Our volunteers have been busy the past three months. After a year long hiatus, the World's Longest Yard Sale was once again held at St. Timothy on August 7. With only half as many vendors as previous years, the vendors who were here were



thrilled with the results of the day. A constant stream of shoppers swept through making purchases. Missing this year were our senior booth and food booth. We are hopeful both will be back next year. We were able to send a check for \$3500 to the Ed Colina Foundation to help with mission expenses at the African School.



The **Back to School Collection** was a huge success. We were able to send countless children to class with notebooks, pencils, crayons and colored pencils etc, to help them in the classroom. Susan Rettig and her grandchildren along with Kate Schmitt helped sort the supplies for City Heights and Be Concerned.

Life Learning Center came to speak at our Masses the weekend of August 28. They serve the "at-risk" population in a holistic way so that they can learn, secure, and sustain a better way of living. They

do this through a 12-week class, that addresses the physical, relational, emotional, spiritual, and financial domains of life. They are supported by volunteers and private donations. They do not bill Medicaid for any of their services or care offer-

ings, all of which are 100% free to their Candidates. We had 2 different volunteer service days at LLC. Our volunteers worked in The Hangar to help to sort clothes, fold dress shirts, display ties, rearrange several different areas and hang up new seasonal arrivals for their clients. On another day we painted several rooms which will be used by their clients.



17 volunteers arrived at DCCH Center for Families and

**Children** for the St. Timothy grant service project. They had a busy morning where they cleaned and cleared the playground and picnic area so foster families



and resident children could gather together to enjoy time together. Afterwards the horses spent a short time with our volunteers. Thank you to everyone who was able to help that day.

Mary Rose Mission is one of our on-going monthly ministries. Every 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday we have been able to help prepare a chicken spaghetti meal with bread, salad and dessert for 50-75



homeless individuals. Through the generosity of our parishioners all the food is donated to make chicken spaghetti. 3-4 cooks help to prepare the meal and then another group of 7- 11 volunteers help serve the food, drinks, provide conversation and fellowship to our homeless population, all with love and dignity. They also help clean up and do all the dishes. This wonderful ministry is open to anyone 14 years of age and older.

Nothing better than food fresh from the garden! In Father Ruschman's Garden, God has blessed us with good soil, great weather, an abundance of various vegetables which are harvested twice weekly by our wonderful dedicated gardeners. They know we are feeding many hungry families in Northern KY. All the food is

delivered to City Heights and to Rose Garden Missions and distributed through their food pantries. Although we are starting to wind down for the year, our gardeners have begun planting the winter greens, have tilled some of the vegetables under and are beginning to plan for the final harvest and next years' crops. This is a wonderful ministry for both individuals and families to participate. They gain knowledge of foods grown, recipes to prepare, and gain fulfillment in knowing they are feeding those less fortunate. No skills are necessary, and no age limit precludes working in the garden. All that is needed is a willingness to help.





**August totals:** Cucumbers 49 lbs, green beans 329 lbs, green peppers 173 lbs, onions 25 lbs, other peppers 37 lbs, red potatoes 1479 lbs, white potatoes 477 lbs, sweet potatoes 195 lbs, tomatoes 923 lbs, zucchini 28 lbs. Aug. grand total 3715 lbs. Not bad for 10 harvest days!!

**September totals:** Collard greens 36 lbs, green beans 14 lbs, green peppers 319 lbs, onions 50 lbs, other peppers 68 lbs, sweet potatoes 340 lbs, tomatoes 842 lbs. Sept. grand total 1669 lbs. Only 8 harvesting days in September.

October totals only include Monday 10/4 because I haven't picked up the paper from 10/12 yet. Green peppers 30 lbs, other peppers 8 lbs, tomatoes 45 lbs. so far a total of 85 lbs.

#### Thank you Gardeners!!!!

**Trick or Treat!** This year was all treat. October rounded out with a collection of record high number of new and gently used Halloween costumes and candy collected to be distributed to the families in City Heights and St. Augustine. It will be a festive area on Halloween night thanks to your generosity.

**Coming Soon!** Your help is greatly need as we move into November and December with the annual Thanksgiving Food and Coat Drive sponsored jointly by the Knights of Columbus, SVdP and Outreach.

Christmas is right around the corner. Our **Angel Giving Tree** is Outreach's largest project each year. We average approximately 16 families in Grant County, 55 families through SVdP and a handful of St. Timothy families that need help through the holidays to provide clothes and toys for their children. Please consider taking a tag and volunteering to help sort items in December. More details will be in the upcoming bulletins.

#### Families for Life By Coleen Brockman

St. Timothy's Families for Life has been working diligently to promote the value of all human life from conception until natural death and at every point in between. As Catholics, we are called to cherish, defend and protect those who are most vulnerable. In Kentucky an estimated 4,000+ abortions were performed in 2020. In our neighboring state of Ohio, approximately 20,000 unborn lives were lost, according to Kentucky Right to Life. During the month of

October, the Church asks us to reflect more deeply on the dignity of every human life.

A "baby shower" was hosted from the middle of September through the beginning of October. We collected 44 packs of diapers, 71 packs of baby wipes, 50 bottles of baby lotion/shampoo and 15 tubes of diaper cream. The Youth Group sorted and loaded the vehicles for our drivers. We delivered to Rose Garden, CareNet, and Madonna House. Thanks to all who donated and volunteered.

We would also like to extend a great big "THANKS" to all those who



helped put up crosses at St. Tim's on October 9. They will remain in place until October 23. I would like to acknowledge Kay & Larry Sendelbach from St. Joseph in Cold Springs for their dedication these past 25 years in organizing, setting up, building and repairing these crosses.

We are providing a list of help agencies which are listed on our website www.saint-timothy.org for those who are aware of anyone who needs assistance or those who would like to volunteer. One agency which is not currently included on the Diocesan list, but very important, is Missing Alexis LLC, started by one of our own parishioners Lisa Louden in 2008. This agency is dedicated to helping those who have experienced miscarriage or infant loss. They provide support, compassion and healing to families who have experienced the loss of a child through miscarriage, prematurity, stillbirth, S.I.D.S., and all other forms of antenatal and neonatal death, as well as to educate the people who support them.


